FIERRO FAMILY HISTORY BASED ON ANCESTRY.COM AND CENSUS RECORDS

(Revised: 7/31/10):

According to website documents at Ancestry.com, our ancestors crossed the Mexican border as early as 1917. Here are the facts documented in government records for Border Crossings from Mexico 1903-1957 and Census Documents for 1920 and 1930. The information is presented based on sequential order as it happened. Lillian provided most of the “In the Beginning” information, plus the stories received from Sisters Ramona, Amelia, and daughter Bertha. It appears to coincide with the information below, plus more detailed information as life progressed for them.

Border Crossing, 3/17/1917: Apolonia Alcaraz Torres (widow of Fortunato Torres), our great-grandmother, was the mother of Clara, Josefa and Fortunato. She crossed with her daughter Josefa through Nogales, Arizona to meet Apolonia’s son Fortunato Jr. who was living in Silver Bell, Arizona as a miner. Her occupation is listed as a cook. Accompanying Apolonia was her daughter-in-law Susana, wife of Fortunato. Apolonia was 5’3”, brown hair and eyes. Apolonia’s birthplace is listed as Choix, Sinaloa, Mexico about 1867. According to the records she had no money when she crossed into the U.S.

Border Crossing, 3/17/1917: Josefa Torres, Clara’s sister, born in Choix, Sinaloa about 1899 and 18 years old when she crossed into the U.S. with her mother Apolonia and sister-in-law in 1917. Josefa was called Tia Josefina by our family. Her occupation is seamstress.

1920 Census: According to the 1920 census, Apolonia and her family were living in Ajo, Arizona. At that time, Josefa was married to Francisco Leyva (name misspelled on census), who was 26 at the time. Fortunato’s wife isn’t listed on the census. Francisco and Fortunato are listed as miners.

Border Crossing, 1/31/1924: Eulalio Fierro – Our grandfather who was born about 1886 crossed into the U.S. through Nogales, Arizona on foot. According to the records, he was 38 years old, 5’11” and had dark brown eyes and black hair and he was born in Choix, Sinaloa, Mexico. It is listed on his application that he traveled with daughters Ramona and Adelina and traveled to stay with mother-in-law Apolonia who was living in Colton, California on L Street. It states he will stay 3 months in the U.S. He crossed the border with \$15.

Border Crossing, 1/4/1925: Amelia, Josephine (Josefina) and Lillian (Maria Lilia) crossed into the U.S. through Nogales, Arizona. Their birthplace is listed as Choix, Sinaloa. Amelia’s age is listed as 16, Josephine is 7 and Lillian is 5. No record of when or with whom Jesse crossed into the U.S.

4/15/1930 Census - The Fierro family was living in Vernon, Sutter County as boarders in a house owned by Facundo Jaragoza (sic). Eulalio Fierro, their father, passed away on 1/18 /1930. The Leyva family was living in Riverside, Riverside County. Apolonia and Fortunato are not listed as living there.

FIERRO FAMILY HISTORY: IN THE BEGINNING.....

Eulalio Fierro: Born: 2/12/1884; Deceased: 1/18/1930 – Age 45

Death Certificate: Died of Acute Disseminated, Pulmonary Tuberculosis

Mother: Jesusita Fierro (maiden last name); Father: His Father's Last Name was Grijalva. (Eulalio Fierro elected to use his mother's maiden name: Fierro)

Spouse: Clara Torres Fierro: Born: Unknown; Deceased: (1924 - early 30's)

Father: Fortunato Torres (Deceased 8/19/1966) and Mother: Apolonia (Alcaraz) Torres (Born in Choix, Sinaloa, Mexico about 1867); Deceased 7/1/1945 – Age 78

Three Children: Clara (Torres) Fierro, Josefina (Torres) Leyva (Born in Choix, Sinaloa, Mexico about 1899) and Fortunato Torres, Jr.

Very little is known about Eulalio's mother, father, and his family. Two versions of Eulalio's real last name have surfaced. One is that Eulalio elected to use his mother's name, Fierro, which is not unusual in Mexico, and his brother elected to use his father's last name, Grijalva. Another confusing aspect is that Eulalio's death certificate states his father's name as "Cosme Fierro" with no listing of the mother's name. However, it was rumored that Eulalio did not associate with the Grijalva family because the Grijalva's were wealthy, and he was poor. However, the Zaragoza family has gone to Mexico several times and met the Grijalva family. They were very gracious and hospitable. The Zaragoza's met Eulalio's brother, who became wealthy because he invested in a sugar factory in Mexico, and who confirmed that Eulalio was not an illegitimate child, as was rumored. The Grijalva family lives in Mexico in a large, beautiful home. The fact that Eulalio elected to use his mother's name, and his brother elected to use his father's last name probably caused the confusion.

Eulalio was a policeman, who married Clara Torres, a seamstress, in Sinaloa, Mexico. Eulalio had dark-brown eyes, black hair, distinguished, and was 5'11" tall. Clara had blue eyes, red hair, had a fair complexion and freckles. She was very personable and well-liked by everyone in the community; it was said she never spoke badly about anyone. Friends would seek her help, and she would heal them with herbs. They had nine children, who were all born in Choix, Sinaloa, Mexico. The nine children were: Ramona (7/19/1907); Amelia (8/10/1909); Eulalio, Jr. (deceased at age seven); Adeline and Jesse, (twins (10/22/1915); Josephine (7/31/1917); Lillian (12/22/1919); and another set of twins (girls), who died at birth with their mother Clara, in 1924. All of the Fierro brothers and sisters have passed away.

In 1924, Eulalio, Ramona and Adeline went to live in Colton, CA, United States with Apolonia, his mother-in-law and her children, Josefina and Fortunato, Jr. In Colton, Eulalio worked in the mines. Clara, who was pregnant, remained in Mexico with Amelia, Josephine, Jess and Lillian. However, several months later Clara, who was pregnant with two twin girls, and living in Mexico died in Amelia's arms. Clara passed away during child birth and complications. Devastated, the family joined Eulalio, the family and relatives in Colton. This time the family lived in their own home near Apolonia for about two years where

Eulalio continued to work in the mines. But soon the mining caused breathing and lung problems for Eulalio, so they moved to San Francisco.

In 1926 they moved to San Francisco. At that time their ages were: Ramona (19), Amelia (17), Adeline and Jesse (11), Josephine (9), and Lillian (7). Ramona helped Amelia get a job in the Chesterfield factory to help support the family, since Eulalio was unable to work. Talking about San Francisco would bring a gleam in their eyes. All of the family loved music. The older girls especially enjoyed dressing up and going to ballroom dances. Amelia was the main one who always wanted to go dancing on Saturday nights, so she would feverishly clean house so that Eulalio would take her. Even though Eulalio did not dance, he liked to dress up and wear nice, expensive suits with a hat, especially his straw hat. He was always ready to take them dancing, and he would sit and watch them as they enjoyed themselves. Thus, the reason the Fierro children grew up loving music and dancing. They always looked forward to the big dances in the grand ballrooms. The girls were so proud when their dance cards were full of pre-requested dances. Since the girls each had only one dancing dress, they shared them with each other, trading. This made them feel like they had a new dress each time they went out.

Thereafter, the Fierro family frequently moved mainly due to Eulalio's lung problems and to migrate with the crops and to find work. After living in Colton and San Francisco, they moved to Woodland in 1928 (on Court Street and then Lincoln Street). Eulalio needed to live in warmer climate and wanted to live near compadres. They lived in Woodland for about two years while he worked at a ranch, and they lived in a big, white house on Court Street where the current fire department is located. It was during this time that Eulalio went to Weimar (a tuberculosis/pulmonary hospital, north of Sacramento) after being diagnosed with tuberculosis. Jesse was about 14 years old, who was driving since he was 13, and the "man of the house," drove Amelia and Ramona to see their father, who was in the hospital about three weeks. Since Jesse was so young and short, pillows and books would be placed on the driver's side so he could see the road ahead. Lillian, Adeline and Josephine would stay with Lola Lucero. On the day he was released from Weimar, it was evident that he was very sick and that afternoon he died with Ramona and Amelia at his bedside. Lillian recalls that Jesse went to pick them up from Ms. Lucero's home. He walked into the room with tears in his eyes, and she knew something was terribly wrong. Lillian was about 10 years old. Eulalio died at a young age of 45 from tuberculosis. He is buried in Woodland at the St. Joseph Cemetery.

When Eulalio passed away in 1930, basically the Fierro children all took care of each other with love and tenderness. Prior to their father's death they had a deep love for each other, but the loving and caring bond was even stronger now. The Court Street home had bad memories, so they moved to another home on Lincoln Street in Woodland. At that time Woodland had many orchards of olive trees, and Amelia, Ramona, and Jesse would go to pick olives to pay for the rent. On Saturday nights after work, the Fierro family would go to the Guerrero family home (on Depot Street). They had informal, weekly gatherings and dancing at their home. Placing chairs along the long living room wall, they would play records and dance. In fact, this is where Ramona and Frank met. Ramona married Frank Zaragoza, and they moved in with the Fierro family on Lincoln Street. Behind their home,

they had a small garage/room that was also rented to two men who Frank knew, and that helped pay for the rent, too. Later the two men moved out and Cirilo (Jose), Frank's brother moved into the room. After living on Lincoln Street, they lived in Yolo near the Yolo Cache Creek School. Then they moved to Robbins.

While everyone went to live and work at Frank's farm labor camp in Robbins, Lillian stayed with the Henry Rico family in Yolo to finish out the school year. Amelia and Ramona cooked at the camp. The younger children did various chores, but still found time to play outside. Then the Fierro family moved to Tulare for about two months to pick cotton. Pete Davalos, who was a laborer at the camp, followed Amelia, and they were married in 1934 in Tulare. Immediately after they got married they went to live in Azusa, and Lillian went to live with Pete and Amelia and to finish out the school year. Meanwhile Jesse (19), Adeline (19) and Josephine (17) moved to Santa Clara to work at the cannery. Lillian joined them later.

The following pages are individualized stories of each of the Fierro family members. Some parts may overlap or duplicate what was stated above. It all depends when the branches broke from the tree, and some may be missing due to time constraints. But one thing that you will notice is that the love, warmth, and giving that the Fierro family had for each other has extended to their children, their grandchildren, their great-grandchildren...and we know will extend to future generations.

Ramona Fierro Zaragoza: Born 7/19/1907; Deceased 2/18/1989 -Age 82 (Stroke, after entering hospital for pneumonia); Buried at St. Joseph's Cemetery, Woodland, CA

Father: Eulalio Fierro: Born 2/12/1884; Deceased 1/18/1930 - Age 45 (Acute Disseminated Pulmonary Tuberculosis); Buried at St. Joseph's Cemetery; Woodland, CA

Mother: Clara Torres Fierro: Born Unknown; Deceased 1924 in her early 30's (Childbirth complications while giving birth to twins girls)

During 1939-44, five other children died at childbirth and there were three miscarriages.

While a teenager, Ramona worked as a tutor and a seamstress to help the family meet its financial obligations. Ramona met and married Frank Zaragoza in Woodland, CA. During the early years of their marriage, they lived on Lincoln Street in Woodland; Ramona's brother and sisters also lived with them after their father passed away in 1930. Ramona's sisters and brother were very important to her so she took over the motherly role and loved and cared for her sisters and brother. Frank took on the fatherly role, gaining a high respect from his sisters- and brothers-in-law. Thus, the reason we brothers and sisters love each other unconditionally and why we are so close.

Frank came to the US as a 14-year-old and worked on the railroads in Lodi, and in Colfax, north of Sacramento; he also worked in the copper mines in Copperopolis (Stanislaus County). After he was married, he became a self-employed farm contractor and managed a labor camp (before and after the bracero program was in affect) for the Godfrey Brothers who operated a large farming business. Ramona and Amelia did the cooking for the laborers (field hands); Jesse and sisters helped out with the cooking and cleaning. In 1934, about the time Amelia married Prospero, Adeline, Jesse, and Josephine moved to Santa Clara to work in food processing plants; Lillian moved to Azusa with Amelia and Prospero. Frank and Ramona, with their three children, Bertha, Gilbert, and Celia, moved to a ranch near Spreckles Sugar Company; shortly thereafter they moved to a home on Cache Creek (off Poleline Road), which was closer to his labor camp.

In 1941 (during the depression), the Godfreys went bankrupt, and Frank found himself out of work. He decided to go into the farming business and approached the owners of the United Market about a possible partnership. The United Market was a family-owned grocery store with whom he had been doing business for many years. They agreed and in 1942, Frank had his first tomato crop that he sold to the newly opened Matmor Canning Company (later known as Contadina). The family then moved to a house on Willow Springs Road; six months later they moved to another ranch near the Beeman Ranch, which was closer to Frank's tomato farm. In 1943, they moved to 309 B Street in Woodland; they had seven children by then. During the war, Lillian and son Daniel moved in with the Zaragozas for several months while Joe Briones, Sr. was in the Navy. In 1945, the Davaloses moved from Azusa to Woodland and lived with the Zaragozas at 309 B Street for several months.

In the summer of 1945, the Zaragozas bought a home at 156 Fourth Street in Woodland. Soon thereafter, Adeline, Sylvia and Tommy lived with us for a short while. Frank was still a tomato grower and still operated a farm labor camp. All his children worked in the tomato fields (except for Bertha who had a job at Joe Harling Jewelers). The highlight of those working days was our mom's great meals, rising at 4:30 am she made our breakfast and packed lunches (always fresh tortillas); and then greeting us in the evening with a hot meal (again, fresh torts) and a big smile. We all spoke Spanish at home since Ramona didn't speak English, and Frank spoke English only with his business associates. Thus, the reason we all speak Spanish today.

Ramona was a housewife, a very loving mother and an excellent cook; she always welcomed family and friends to her home. During the Depression, she provided food for the homeless. Ramona enjoyed music; even as a little girl she loved to sing and dance. Because of her deep love for music, she exposed her children to the same. Bertha took piano lessons; Celia took tap dancing lessons; Gil and the twins took guitar lessons; Lucy, piano lessons; and Rosie played the clarinet. Ramona also had Gil and Celia dress up in Mexican attire, and they danced folklorico dances at Mexican fiestas. Las Chapanecas was a favorite. In the 1930's at "Las Fiestas Patrias" on September 16, Ramona would perform on stage by singing, in her opera-like soprano voice, the Mexican National Anthem and other songs; her children would also perform by dancing. In 1950, Celia was Queen of the Fiestas Patrias in Woodland; Lucy performed at the celebration by dancing the mambo; a few years later Jess and cousin Molly danced the mambo for the Fiestas Patrias celebration. The twins continued playing guitars and singing throughout their school years, participating in talent shows and other functions; they sang at all the family affairs. The twins continue to entertain us with their beautiful music.

Frank was born in Durango, Mexico. He had 1 brother, 4 sisters and 5 cousins, including Gumercindo and Cirilo (Jose). Frank worked hard his entire life. Even as an 8-year-old he was working up in the high Sierra Madres selling wood on burros. Frank was a self-taught man who learned to read and write on his own; he did not have a formal education although he did attend school one year, the equivalency of the sixth grade. He was a very strong, proud man and worked very hard to be successful. He never forgot his roots or where he came from. He always made it a point to send money back home to Mexico to his family. When he had a good crop year, he would take Ramona and the family to Mexico to visit and share his good fortune with his family. He was a very generous and caring father, brother, and uncle and always made sure his family was well taken care of. Ramona was very supportive and played a big role in making all this possible.

Frank and Ramona have always instilled family values to their children and to all with whom they came in contact. They both taught the importance of closeness within families, which is the reason we are all such a close-knit, loving family. Frank died of natural causes and Ramona died unexpectedly of a combination pneumonia/heart attack; they are buried in Woodland in a plot near Eulalio, Prospero, Amelia, Gene, Clara, Jess, and Dan Briones. Their deceased children and Grandchildren are also nearby.

Bertha attended Holy Rosary School in Woodland. At 12 she learned to drive a car since we lived in the country and she had to transport her siblings and friends (the Garcias) to/from school. Bertha helped raise Gilbert, Celia, Joe, Lolly, Clara, David, and Lucy. As a teenager, she was one of the leaders of the Club Juvenile Mexicana, a Mexican youth club where they took Spanish lessons and practiced marching for Las Fiestas Patrias. Bertha also took piano lessons. She had a good voice and could yodel better than Judy Canova, a famed country-western singer.

As a young adult, Bertha worked for Joe Harling Jewelers for many years. After their marriage, Ted was in the Army, stationed in Germany; during this time, Bert lived with us on Fourth Street. In 1946, Ted was discharged, and in 1947 they bought their home at 134 Clover Street. Bertha had two favorite hobbies: gardening and playing cards with her family and friends. She loved being with her children and spending time with her grand. She also filled the mother role for her sisters and brothers after Ramona's death in 1989. Until his death, Ted continued to be involved in farming by planting his yearly garden. He

remained active in the Fraternal Order of Eagles and while he was still able would sneak in a round of golf every once in a while with his kids. Every summer he would make a trip to visit Pat and Christopher in Washington. Ted made a trip to Mexico with Mike and his brother-in-law Chris in 1999. This was his first time back to Mexico since he left when he was a toddler.

I graduated from Woodland High School in 1950 and from St. Mary's College in Moraga with a Business Degree in 1954. Jess graduated from Woodland High School in 1964. He was in the farming business with my father and brother Joe (Zaragoza Farms and in 1973 became Frank Zaragoza and Sons, Inc.) from 1965 to 1991, at which time he retired. In the 1980's we (Frank Zaragoza and Sons, Inc.) received the Mexican-American Community Award for supporting youth and adult activities.

On December 8, 1988, the Yolo County farmers elected Jess as a board member of the USDA representing Yolo County and surrounding counties. He served for 3 years. Yolo County farmers also elected him as a board member of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation

Service (ASCS). He did not run for office but was asked by Neil Busch, County Executive Director, to submit his name for election by the farmers.

Jess became an official partner with my Dad in 1965. He remembered the day very clearly: "He gave me a check for all my hard work. I was very surprised when I received the check. I paused for several minutes and asked my Dad if I could use the money for anything, and he said in his strong voice, 'Yes.' I endorsed the check and returned it to him. He was surprised and asked me what I was doing, and I told him that I would like to be his official partner in farming. My Dad with a big smile on his face stood up and so did I. He shook my hand and said it would be his pleasure to have me as his partner. My Dad then gave me a hug and I, in turn, gave him a big hug, and I do believe he was very proud of my decision. I thought I would then be a boss also, but I continued doing the hard work and laughed within myself; I told my Mom and she also laughed with me. I was taught farming from my Dad since I was 5 years old and; both he and my mom also taught me to speak Spanish since I only knew English until I was 5 years old. I loved farming and always had a passion for it."

We used Mexican nationals (under the bracero program) to hand-pick our tomatoes; some locals were also used, including Gil, Joe, Lolly, Joe, Clara, and Lucy. After machines were developed to pick the tomatoes, many of our nephews and nieces also participated during the summer. They decided that wasn't what they wanted to do for a living, so became more enthused to pursue their educations!

Jess volunteered for the military in October 1965 and received an honorable discharge October 1971. He continued working in the farming business while traveling to Mexico with his parents. In 1974 Jess started a family. His son Jason and twin boys Mathew and Michael were his LIFE. His twins were born with challenges that put a strain on his relationship with their mother. He decided to raise his twin boys alone while Jason lived with his mother. His mother and niece Bobbi helped him with his boys while he worked. A very dedicated father and hard worker; he did find time to enjoy listening to his idol Elvis Presley aside from his twin brothers of course! He remarried when the twins were approximately 7 years old. He also saw his son Jason as much as possible. After the twins graduated from Woodland High, he purchased a duplex and continued to devote his life to his twins. He is buried in Woodland next to his sister Clara and Cousin Dan Briones and near our parents, grandfather and other family members.

Jason has worked for Snows Construction drilling oil wells for approximately 13 years. His son Xavier Elijah is the spitting image of his grandfather with the most gorgeous blue eyes ever! I am sure Jess is looking down proudly as ever on his kids!

Amelia Fierro Davalos. Born 8/10/1909, Choix, Sinaloa, Mexico; Deceased 5/22/1994 – Age 84, Amelia lived at 309 B Street, Woodland, CA from 1944-1994.

Father: Eulalio Fierro. Mother: Clara Torres Fierro. (See family history)

Spouse: Prospero (Pete) Davalos. Born 7/30/1906; Deceased 3/26/1980 – Age 73, Prostrate Cancer and Pulmonary complications. They are both buried in St. Joseph's Cemetery in Woodland, CA.

Amelia was born in Choix, Sinaloa, Mexico, and was the second child in the Fierro family. At a very young age she stopped going to school because she had no shoes to wear, and she was needed at home to help care for her brothers and sisters. She said she probably had the equivalency of a 5th grade education. When they were young and living in Mexico, we have a picture of them standing behind potted plants because they had no shoes and were embarrassed to be seen barefooted.

In 1924 Amelia's mother, Clara, was in Mexico pregnant with twin girls. Eulalio was in the United States in Colton with Ramona and Adeline, planning to return home to be with his pregnant wife and family. He was temporarily working in the mines and living with his Mother, Apolonia. Amelia was about 15 years old at home with her mother, Josephine, Jess, and Lillian. Clara sadly passed away in Amelia's arms during premature childbirth. Needless to say, it was a traumatic experience for a young girl having her mother die in her arms. After her mother's sudden death, the family moved to the United States to live in Colton, CA renting a home to live near her grandmother, Apolonia, family and friends. While in Colton, Amelia worked at a Mexican grocery store to help support the family. After work she would come home to do the motherly duties of caring for her younger brother and sisters.

Then in 1926 the family moved to San Francisco to live with Ramona, who was working at Chesterfield, a cigarette-making company. Ramona helped Amelia (17) to get a job at the Chesterfield factory to help support the family. Eulalio was having lung/breathing problems caused by working in the mines and could no longer work. She would tell us stories about working at a very young age, standing all day on a box while stuffing cigarettes in packages while the machines were circulating. The job was dangerous. For fun, they would go to Saturday night dances and "Tardeadas," Sunday afternoon dances. She especially looked forward to getting dressed up to go to these dances. She would work hard all day Saturday cleaning house and cooking, and as a reward, Eulalio would take her and her sisters to the ballroom dances. The girls would trade dresses, so they would be wearing a different dress each weekend. Eulalio would dress in his finest suit and hat. Amelia loved flowers and would put flowers in her hair. She was thin and tall: 5'6" with dark-curly black hair, and very attractive.

Eulalio needed to move to a warmer climate and wanted to be near friends and "compadres," so they moved to Woodland to live on Court Street. To support themselves, the Fierro family picked olives, and Jess and Adeline went to school. While living on Court Street, Eulalio became very ill. They found a spot in his lung; he was diagnosed with tuberculosis. He was hospitalized at Weimar (a lung/pulmonary hospital) for approximately three weeks. Jess, at the age of 14, would take Ramona and Amelia to visit. Jess would drive with a pillow or telephone book under his seat so that he could see the road and reach the pedals. The younger children would stay with Mrs. Lucero. They must have known that he did not have long to live, because on the day Eulalio came home from Weimar he was still very ill. He died in Amelia and Ramona's arms. Amelia was only 21 years old. So after her father's death, they did not want to live on Court Street, so they rented another home in Woodland on Lincoln

Street. Soon after her father's death, Frank and Ramona were married. Then the Fierro family moved to Yolo, Robbins, and Tulare basically moving to find work.

It was in Robbins where Amelia met Prospero (Pete) Davalos, who was a migrant worker. They courted for about three years, mostly via letters. Ramona and Amelia did the cooking at the labor camp with the younger brother and sisters helping. When the Fierro family moved to Tulare for about two months to pick cotton, Pete followed Amelia. Pete and Amelia were married in Tulare on 1/11/1934. She was 24 years old and Pete was 27. Their wedding picture shows Adeline and Jess and another couple at their wedding. After the marriage, Lillian went to live with Pete and Amelia in Azusa, California. Jess, Adeline, and Josephine went to work at a cannery in Santa Clara. Later when Lillian was older, she joined them in Santa Clara. In 1945, the Davalos family moved from the Los Angeles area to Woodland. They moved in with the Zaragoza family, all living at 309 B Street (about 20 adults and children: 9 Davalos; 9 Zaragozas; 2 Brioneses). Then Zaragozas bought a home on 4th street, and the Davalos family bought the home at 309 B Street. The home is still there, sold, and the new owner has made extensive improvements to the home from the ground up, and adding a garage. New homes are being built and parts of the neighborhood are being remodeled, but some of the old neighborhood is still barely standing.

Pete Davalos (Davalos name translates to "a flock of birds") was born in Encarnacion de Dios, Jalisco. Pete was about 5'7", very fair with light-brown hair, and hazel-green eyes. They called him "Guerro," the "white boy." In Jalisco it is common to be very fair, blonde and blue-eyed. He had three brothers and four sisters, who mainly lived in Azusa, California. The brothers were Alex, Joe (who owned a Davalos Market), and Johnny. The sisters were Antonia (Tonia), Lola, Lucy, and Lupe (who lived in Mexico with her husband and family). Lola chose Elizabeth as her religious name. She was a Catholic nun in Texas for over 50 years, and passed away in 1998.

Interestingly, a number of brothers and sisters from the Fierro, Davalos, and Alvarez families married each other: (Alex Davalos and Evelyn Alvarez; Tonia Davalos and Ramon Alvarez; Pete Davalos and Amelia Fierro; and Josephine Fierro and Joe Alvarez). We guess it was all those family gatherings and tardeadas!

Pete was very quiet and rarely spoke of his childhood. But we recall him saying that when he was about ten years old, both the government and revolutionary soldiers were threatening and stealing from them constantly. One day, they heard soldiers coming. His father hid them in a basement, and gave Pete a loaded gun. He told him to shoot his brothers and sisters if they were found, mainly because the soldiers would kill/torture his brothers and rape his sisters. He could hear the soldiers trying to provoke his father to get him outside (probably to shoot him because that was what they were doing at the time), but his mother would not let him go outside. That night the family moved to the United States via El Paso, Texas on 5/5/1915 with only their clothes on their back; Pete was about ten.

While living in the United States, Pete went to a catholic school and had to wear a uniform, i.e., navy-blue shorts, white shirt, and a small navy-blue cap. He was constantly being teased by other boys in the neighborhood, and was always getting into fights because of his uniform. He stopped going to school because he had no shoes. He said that initially, they would put cardboard inside the sole to try to keep the water out. He had a 5th grade education, but basically taught himself to read and write. He would read the newspaper from front to back daily, especially enjoying the sports page, reading "The Woodland Democrat, The

Sacramento Bee and La Opinion (a Mexican newspaper).” You would see him either in the kitchen or outside on hot days reading his magazines and newspapers. He loved to watch sports on television, and recall him watching the boxing fights: “Friday Night at the Madison Square Garden,” and chain smoking Camels or Lucky Strike cigarettes; sometimes he would smoke a cigar.

Pete worked in the fields and at Spreckels Sugar in Woodland for 25 years with only one day of sick leave! Amelia stayed home with the kids. During the summer time, the Davalos family would live and work temporarily in Fairfield/Suisun to pick prunes for the DeGracia family. Pete had experienced three depressions and was fearful of losing the home, so the earnings that summer would go towards payment of the home for the year, plus each of the kids would get money to spend on school clothes. And he didn’t believe in charge cards...no Visa, Master Cards. Everything was paid for in cash!

Most of us spoke Spanish at home since Amelia didn’t speak English very well, and Pete spoke both Spanish and fluent English. Sometimes on Saturdays Pete and Amelia would go shopping in their small black Ford. Since Amelia was frequently ill, Pete would make sure there was food at the table for all of the children, and he became an excellent cook. Pete did not believe in spankings, so he disciplined his eight children with a stern look that made you quickly obey.

Pete died of prostate cancer. When he was first diagnosed, the doctor gave him six months to live; however, the family researched “laetrile,” which was actually apricot pit seeds that were made into liquid that had to be injected in the arm or pills. We found a doctor in Albany, CA who provided the laetrile service/products. Pete, Bob and Louie Marquez gave Pete, Sr., the shots, and we purchased the expensive pills. The doctor’s office was later closed. It was more difficult to get laetrile. The good news was that he lived another five years. He stopped taking the pills that cost about \$200 per month because of the expense, and he believed he no longer had the cancer. But the cancer re-occurred.

Amelia was a full-time housewife. We can recall coming home from school, smelling the warm tortillas and warm meals coming from the kitchen. She had a knack for cooking. Everything she cooked was good, having the ability to make fantastic meals with a limited budget. Pete especially liked her potato salad, fried chicken, chili beans, rice pudding, chili, and “capirotada” (Mexican bread pudding). To save money, she would can tomatoes, pears, peaches, prunes; nopales (green cactus) etc., and store them for the winter months. Once a month we would go shopping for 100 pounds of bean, flour, rice, potatoes, etc., with oatmeal almost every morning. We recall family, friends and neighbors visiting and sharing meals on the weekends. The men would be outside cooking a huge pig in a make-shift hole in the ground pouring beer on it. She loved music, and enjoyed singing with Ramona, especially listening to the twins, Lolly and Joe Zaragoza, sing. We recall one of her favorite songs was “Sin Ti (Without You).”

Amelia and Pete enjoyed going to the Mexican movies in Sacramento and Woodland (the Yolo Theatre that was demolished many years ago). She always enjoyed visiting with her brother and sisters. As a special treat, Amelia and Ramona loved going to eat “chicken fried steak,” and Chinese food.

Pete and Amelia instilled in their children to get good grades at school and to get a high school education. In those days, many children quit high school to work in the fields to help support

their families, but Pete and Amelia were adamant about their children getting a high school diploma. Even though it was hard work leaving Woodland for about 3 months during the summer to work in the fields in Fairfield while living in tents, barns or small homes, picking prunes, peaches, pears, etc., we accomplished something as a family. We worked with a unified goal to pay for the yearly mortgage payment and for our school clothes. We played, cried and laughed during those times. And most important, we learned how difficult it is to earn money working in the fields, so we were determined to get good grades and our high school education. Pete often said, "If you get an education, you have a choice. Otherwise, you have no choice." For graduation, the girls would get a Timex watch, and the boys would get a suitcase (because they were going off to college or to the Army).

Amelia died from a prolonged illness from several stokes and pneumonia; she had a long history of medical problems with approximately 7 surgeries. She had diabetes, high blood pressure, thyroid problems, etc. During her later years, Maria her caregiver, lived in the home; but Maria was more than a caregiver and more like a sister. She took care of Amelia while she was bedridden for about 5 years. Amelia and Pete always encouraged us to keep good values/beliefs and to keep those warm, family connections. We are always happy to see our families, relatives and friends, in both happy and sad occasions. Amelia and Pete are buried next to Ramona and Frank at St. Joseph's Cemetery in Woodland, where they spent most of their lives with fond memories of their family and friends.
